Message from Andy Fleming, Missionary in Ukraine: Hi dear friends and family, just a note from the Flemings and Yakovlevs in Ukraine to say that we are OK... Thank you everyone for your prayers!

We woke up yesterday morning to 6 artillery bangs and an explosion — the Ukrainians had shot down a Russian aircraft of some type. It fell in the neighborhood that my son-in-law

grew up in about 11 km from us--apparently one piece of shrapnel fell in our neighborhood and destroyed a car and truck and set off all the car alarms. Since that time, the air raid alerts has sent us to the shelter four times and tanks have approached Kiev and many missiles fired. The cost in human life is already in the hundreds after just two days and the explosions came pretty regularly last night--especially between 3am and 4:30am. We remained in the shelter for 8 hours last night, which is the basement of our apartment building normally inhabited by cats, and slept on old chairs, crates, and pallets. This whole situation is tragic and I'm sure close to the heart of God.

The picture is Tammy sleeping on a wooden box at about 2:30am this morning. We have some of the most amazing neighbors and I'm proud to be part of this community. Britain, Max and little Zak are all well, but we are all fairly exhausted from the experience. At the same, we now that many others have it much worse, and are grateful for the Ukrainians seeking justice and right for their country and nation.

Tammy and I are determined to stay with Brit, Max and Zak, and do whatever we can to help support them and the brothers and sisters in the church here.

Again, thank you for all your prayers. Please keep them coming!!
